

RE-ELECTION FOR SENIOR MINISTER (4TH TERM) REV DARRYL CHAN

Dear PSPC family, some of you might know that my older daughter Rachel turned 18 this year. At this milestone, a young person has reached the minimum age to learn how to drive, open an investment account and even consume alcohol. Of course, none of these is relevant for this write-up, if only for the fact that I started my ministry in PSPC in the very same year that she was born. If you had asked me when I first graduated from seminary whether I would still be serving in the same church after 18 years, I



would have found that quite unthinkable in an era of high pastoral attrition. Indeed, it is through the grace and mercy of God as well as your prayers and support that 18 years – including 12 years (3 terms) as Senior Minister – have come and gone, Yet despite 18 years being the third longest pastoral tenure in PSPC's history, I marvel at God's abundant supply of grace for Rev Benjamin Keasberry's 32 years (1843 - 1875) and Rev William Murray's 33 years (1902 - 1935).

Over the years, I have conducted the weddings of couples who used to be Prinsep Lighthouse (PLH) youths when I first started my ministry. Today, they still call me "Uncle" Darryl even though a number of them have gone on to become parents and whose children I have had the privilege to baptise. I have sometimes wondered what all these mean for an extended pastorate. I heard that at the entrance of an ancient church in France, there is a signboard urging people to enter the ministry. It says, "There are just four days in anyone's life: birth, confirmation, marriage, death. Would you not like to be one who would be needed on all four of those days?" Among the first cohort of infants whom I had baptised, some of them have started to join PLH. In a few years, I will be conducting their confirmation. Perhaps, if I live long enough, I may even conduct their wedding. But I have gotten ahead of myself.

The benefits and challenges as well as hits and misses of an extended pastorate have been well-documented. Just like the promises of a brand-new beginning, it is alluring to dream about how a pastor and a church can have a fresh new start. Yet I have often pictured my situation as though I am walking down a long corridor looking through the windows showcasing other Christian ministries, but with doors which are not meant for me. The only way forward is to continue down that long corridor that is PSPC. Thus, God has called my life, gifted my ministry and bound my vocation to His people here in PSPC – to know three, even four, generations of congregants and their families.

The Session has issued the call for me to undergo re-election as Senior Minister for the 4th term (2025 - 2029). I seek your prayers as this next term will involve the launch, implementation and completion of our Building Renewal Project (BRP). The leadership focus is to have a "Completed Building with Church Unity", "Renewed Building with Renewed Congregation" and "Larger Premises with Expanded Ministry". Together as staff, leadership and congregation, let us be "*Renewing Our Hearts, Building As One*" (PSPC Church Theme 2025). Amen.

Rev Darryl Chan is married to Angeline who is the Principal of Presbyterian High School. An educator at heart, she teaches English to domestic helpers in the HELLO Class. Their daughters, Rachel and Rebecca, are in the PLH. For psycho-spiritual wellbeing, they are not brought up as the stereotypical PKs (Pastor's Kids) or even Pastor's and Principal's Kids. Instead, they are raised as normal teenagers, with a normal childhood, in a normal family, by normal parents.

RE-ELECTION FOR ASSOCIATE MINISTER (2ND TERM) REV CHEAM WAN XIAN

Rev Cheam Wan Xian came to know the Lord Jesus Christ at the age of 12 and first sensed her calling to full-time ministry in her youth. She underwent theological training at Singapore Bible College (SBC) and graduated with a Master of Divinity (MDiv). Wan Xian is married to Rev Paul Tong and they have an adult daughter, Tong Xu Han.



PSPC Chinese Service

It was in 2016 that Rev Wan Xian was approached by Rev Darryl to come over to

PSPC as a volunteer to help start the Mandarin Service. In 2017, she joined the PSPC Pastoral Team and continued to prepare the Chinese Ministry to begin the Mandarin Service which was inaugurated on 7 January 2018.

Rev Wan Xian's primary responsibilities are the preaching of the word of God, coordinating the preaching calendar, pastoral and congregational care, evangelism and outreach, and serve together with the Core Team to provide leadership for the overall health and direction of the Chinese Ministry. She is also the Pastoral Advisor for Sarah Active Ageing Centre (SAAC). Rev Wan Xian is also presently a member of the Synod Women's Council.

Rev Wan Xian licensing was completed and accepted by the English Presbytery Exco on 19 May 2021. PSPC leadership had the privilege to witness her taking the Licentiate Pledge on the 1 June 2021. She was ordained to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament and installed as PSPC Associate Minister on 11 September 2021.

Re-election as PSPC Associate Minister

In recognition of her faithful and effective ministry, PSPC Session issued the call to Rev Wan Xian to stand for re-election as Associate Minister to continue to grow the Mandarin Service. Together with the Core Team, she will continue to shepherd the flock, reach out to Chinese speaking seekers who have not yet had the opportunity to hear and believe the Good News of Jesus Christ.

CARBON FAST FOR LENT Week Focus: WASTE MANAGEMENT - REUSE (6 – 12 April 2025)



"THE WHOLE CREATION HAS BEEN GROANING ..." (ROMANS 8:22)

At creation, God established three fundamental relationships for humans: (i) to himself (Gen. 1:26-28); (ii) to each other (2:18, 23); (iii) to non-human creation (2:15). When Adam and Eve sinned against God, all three relationships were broken: God expelled them from the Garden of Eden (Gen. 3:24), they blamed each other for their sin (3:12-13), and the good earth was cursed and subject to frustration and futility (3:17-19). This third broken relationship is depicted by Paul as "the whole creation groaning" (Rom. 8:22).

But it does not groan forever. Just like a woman groans in the pangs of childbirth (Rom. 8:22), she knows that her pain is temporary, while she waits eagerly for her baby to be born. Similarly, creation which has been subjected to futility has been groaning but it is also waiting with eager longing for its redemption. This redemption is tied in to the reconciliation between God and humankind, for God's redemption plan is for all of God's creation (Rom. 8:18-25).

What is creation waiting for? Paul tells us that it is waiting for "the revealing of the sons of God" (Rom. 8:19). It is waiting for God's children to be glorified. Tom Wright explains: "The creation ... is waiting to benefit wonderfully when God's children are glorified. It is waiting – on tiptoe with expectation, in fact – for that particular freedom it will enjoy when God gives to his children that glory, that wise rule and stewardship, which was always intended for those who bear God's glorious image."

As the redeemed people of God, we can exercise "that wise rule and stewardship" over God's creation now. We can take small steps to reuse items to reduce demand for new resources. We can bring our own mugs for coffee on Sundays, a container for our takeaway from the hawker centre, a shopping bag for groceries. We can buy "pre-loved" (or second-hand) items (for our trip to Shetland, I bought a "pre-loved" Tommy Hilfiger sweater for £5!).

Prayer

"Heavenly Father, thank you for the material things you have given us. Forgive us for discarding things quickly without thinking of how we can reuse them. Help us to be wise stewards of your good gifts. Amen."



REFLECTIONS

Our Core Identity: Being Made in the Image of God

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness. ... so God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

Genesis 1:26-27

We are facing a crisis of identity in our 21st century world. Many people are confused about their identity. There are conflicts based on ethnicity, nationality, sexuality, and economic status. As we move into an age of advanced artificial intelligence, these issues may become even more complex.

As Christians, our identity is closely connected to God's creation. The Bible teaches that we are made in the image of God (Latin: *Imago Dei*). This concept has been developed over time:

- 1. **Early Church**: The early church fathers, like Augustine, focused on *Imago Dei* as reflecting the rational soul, emphasizing humanity's unique capacity for reason and relationship with God. The image was often understood as being spiritual, connected to intellect and will.
- 2. **Medieval Period**: Theologians like Thomas Aquinas developed the concept further, linking *Imago Dei* to the human ability to know and love God. They distinguished between the "image" (which all humans retain) and "likeness" (which grows through sanctification).
- 3. **Reformation**: Protestant reformers, like Martin Luther and John Calvin, highlighted the impact of sin, arguing that the *Imago Dei* was marred but not erased by the Fall. They focused on restoring our relationship with God and others through Christ.
- 4. **Modern Era**: Enlightenment and post-Enlightenment thinkers began emphasizing the social and relational dimensions of *Imago Dei*. Karl Barth, for example, connected it to human relationships, seeing it as a reflection of the triune God's relational nature.
- 5. **Contemporary Theology**: Today, *Imago Dei* is often explored in terms of ethics and justice, such as human dignity, equality, and care for creation. It has also been expanded to address issues like gender, race, and environmental stewardship, often with a focus on inclusivity. Hence notice the link to PSPC's carbon fast during this Lent season.

Each era has built upon the foundational belief that humans uniquely reflect God's image, adding depth and relevance to this rich theological concept of who we are and why we are created in the image of God.

During this Lent season, we should remember God's creative and redemptive purposes. We are created to glorify God and enjoy Him forever. However, our relationship with God has been damaged by sin. God showed His love for us by sending His Son to die for our sins on the Cross.

According to Augustine, after the Fall, humanity lost the ability not to sin (Latin: *non posse non peccare* – not able not to sin). Sin became an inherent part of human nature, and humans were bound by it. Through salvation and regeneration in Christ, we regain the ability not to sin (Latin: *posse non peccare* – able to sin and able not to sin). This state reflects the transformative power of grace in the lives of believers.

Therefore, let us encourage one another as we prepare to enter the Holy Week:

.. to put off your old self, which belongs to your former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.

Ephesians 4:22-24

As Reformed Christians, we are secure in our identity and knowledge that we are made in the image and likeness of God. While this reflection is brief, I hope it encourages us to grow closer to God and His people.
